Case Study 1A


ABC Agricultural Merchants are based in Exeter. The company stocks a range of chemicals for local farmers and offers a haulage operation to collect product from farmers for delivery to other customers, using a vehicle with a maximum permissible mass of 6 tonnes.

Last Monday, ABC had to make two deliveries to farmers, as detailed below, and one collection. The deliveries were loaded onto the vehicle which then collected two pallets of animal feeds. The pallets were picked up **before** the deliveries were carried out.

The aerosols were packed and marked as 'Limited Quantities'.

UN2784 is supplied by the manufacturer to ABC in a box containing 2 x 10L plastic bottles; the package has the following UN mark:

 4G/Y25/S/11/F BVT83428

UN3006 is supplied by the manufacturer to ABC in 5L jerricans with the following UN mark:

 3H1/X/100/11/D BAM4678

Shortly after collecting the animal feeds and **prior to making any deliveries** the driver took a break at a café. HSE inspectors saw the vehicle and stopped to inspect it.

When the driver returned, he assisted the inspectors, who had identified some problems with the consignment and the vehicle.

- (a) A model no. 5.1 placard was being displayed on each side of the vehicle; there were no other markings. Was this correct? If not, what markings and/or placards (including dimensions) should have been displayed on the vehicle and where?

When questioned about this, the driver claimed he had been advised that details of this consignment were not required. Is this correct? Explain your answer.
